A higher proportion of female offenders were first time offenders, compared to males. Of all female offenders cautioned or convicted in 2019, 35% were first time offenders, compared to 22% for males. Females had a higher average number of reoffences per reoffender compared to males, at 4.33 and 3.99, respectively.
